

TURNAROUND SCHOOL:

PROCEDURE OF REASSIGNMENT FOR LICENSED EMPLOYEES

- 1. When a school is designated a Turnaround School, and teachers are selected for reassignment, the affected teacher will initially be assigned a new school site.
 - a. The affected teacher has the option to ACCEPT the reassignment as given, OR
 - b. Chose not to accept the reassignment.
 - c. If they choose not to accept the reassignment, the teacher will be allowed to participate in the next upcoming surplus meeting to select a new school based on SENIORITY.
- 2. The affected teacher may also still try for voluntary transfer even though they have chosen either A or B (*above*).
- 3. If you get selected in voluntary transfer, you can choose to accept the voluntary transfer instead of your selection in Surplus or reassignment.
- 4. Through a recent Unfair Labor case settlement, CCEA has ensured that those teacher affected by Turnaround are afforded a choice as to what school they go to.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ):

1. Is there a particular number or percentage of teachers that have to be reassigned?

a. No. There is no specific number or percentage of teachers that have to be reassigned. The purpose is to have the space to bring in a certain number of experienced and new teachers to create balance in order to "turn around" the school. It is often a combination of looking at each department or grade-level to see what is needed, and what you have a lot of (i.e., New teachers to experienced teachers). The right balance is what is being achieved.

2. Does administration have a say in who is reassigned?

a. The new administrator has a say, but not your prior administrator.

3. Does discipline or unsatisfactory evaluation have an impact on who is reassigned?

- a. No. If you have been selected to be reassigned, it is NOT because they think you are a bad teacher. Rather, they are looking at each department and grade to try and make space in each department for a few new teachers, which means some will get reassigned.
- 4. What if I can't go to the school I've been reassigned because of a special circumstance, such as medical, geography, etc.?
 - a. If you have a special circumstance and you have been reassigned, please contact CCEA (702-733-3063) as soon as possible so that we can work with the District.

5. Will the school I am reassigned to think I came because I have a bad record?

a. No. This will not be the case. Given the number of new hires and transfers each year, schools do not consider a person transferring in through reassignment or surplus to be someone that has a bad record, they rarely will know a transfer from a reassignment or surplus.

b. In our experience, nearly every teacher that has been reassigned or selected another school through surplus has reported that they are very happy at their new school.

6. Will anyone not be reassigned and simply lose their job?

a. **Absolutely not.** No one will lose their job. Everyone that is affected will be assigned a new school or given the option to select a school through surplus. (see procedure above)
