As a legislator, Giunchigliani sponsored a bill to water down basic standards for Nevada's public schools and turn high school diplomas into nothing more than a certificate of attendance. As a commissioner, she voted against an additional \$13 million a year for education funding. In times of need when Clark County educators needed support, Giunchigliani wasn't around.

Throughout her almost 30-year career as a politician, Giunchigliani used her elected positions voting to increase her salary and perks, making it easier to receive gifts from lobbyists and even using campaign donations to enrich her own household.
