# **Engaging Stakeholders in Effective Communication**

• For example: Improving student test scores, getting parents involved in academics, communicating about discipline, etc.

#### Read the research:

- You will synthesizes current research and resources to gain an understanding of global education. After synthesizing, you will determine appropriate practices that incorporate global education.
- You will build upon the identified considerations for practice by incorporating strategies and activities that support global education practices. Then you will reflect and categorize them according to the four global competencies.
- You will use current research and resources aligned with global education to create a yearly resource plan. Then, you will identify strategies and activities that support the global competence framework, and incorporate them into lessons, assignments, activities, or assessments.

- You will use current research and resources aligned with parental engagement to identify activities and strategies aimed at supporting families as partners and addressing barriers to family engagement.

### **Motivating Learners**

### **Read the research:**

- You will employ research to identify characteristics of the learner environments that support and improve student motivation. The educator will then align research-based strategies to be implemented within the school or classroom environment.
- You will evaluate current practices for fostering motivation through interactions and identify research-based strategies to improve student-to-student and educator-to-student interactions.
- You will create a plan to support student motivation through identifying challenges to student motivation, aligning strategies to support the classroom or site environment, and fostering motivation through interactions.

## **Understanding All Learners**
