Eligibility Requirement

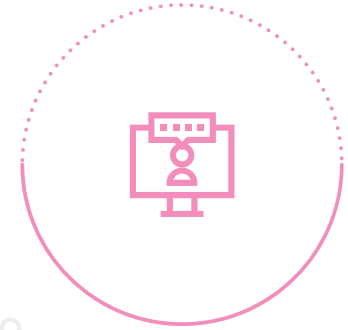

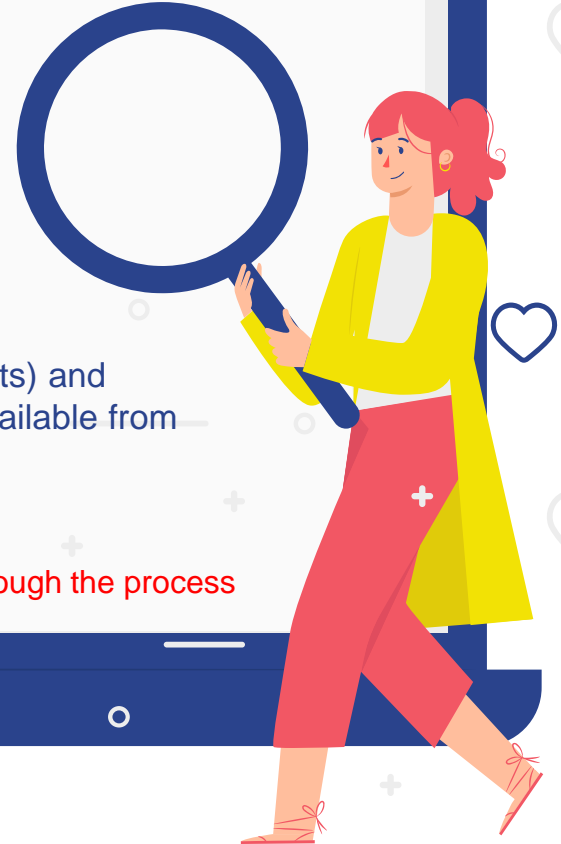

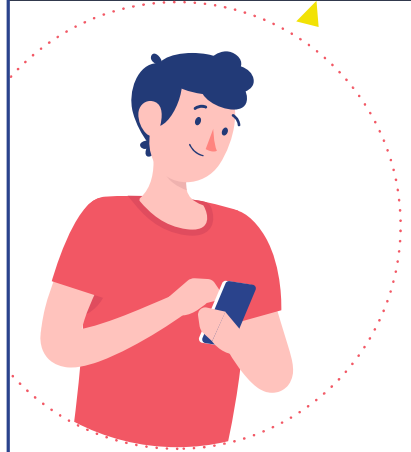
You can spread the cost of your component(s) over six equal monthly installments (about \$80 per component per month)

You must submit all 4 components within a 3-year window

You have two more years to achieve certification (5 years total)

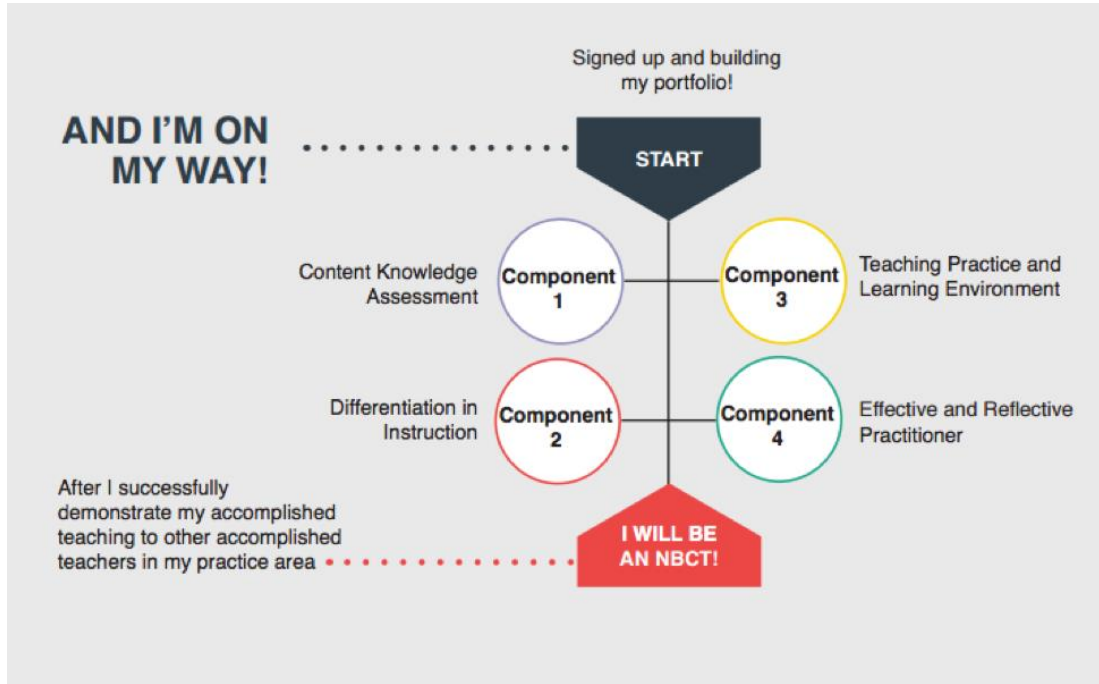




NB 5 Core Propositions

1. Teachers are committed to students and their learning.
2. Teachers know the subjects they teach and how to teach those subjects to students.
3. Teachers are responsible for managing and monitoring student learning.
4. Teachers think systematically about their practice and learn from experience.
5. Teachers are members of learning communities.

National Board Certification Timeline



The 4 components can be submitted in **any order**.

Candidates can complete from 1 to all 4 components a year.

Candidates must submit all 4 components within the first 3 years of their candidacy.

While it is possible to complete the process in as little as one year, there is a five-year window to achieve certification.

Note: Although candidates are provided with five years to complete the certification process, all purchased components must be completed during the assessment cycle in which they are purchased.

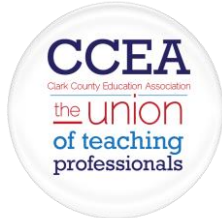

A person may renew their NV Educator license **by submitting a copy of their NBCT certificate** which evidences the completion of the requirements for certification.

The license renewal would be valid for the life of the certificate (5 years) or the normal term of license renewal; whichever is longer.



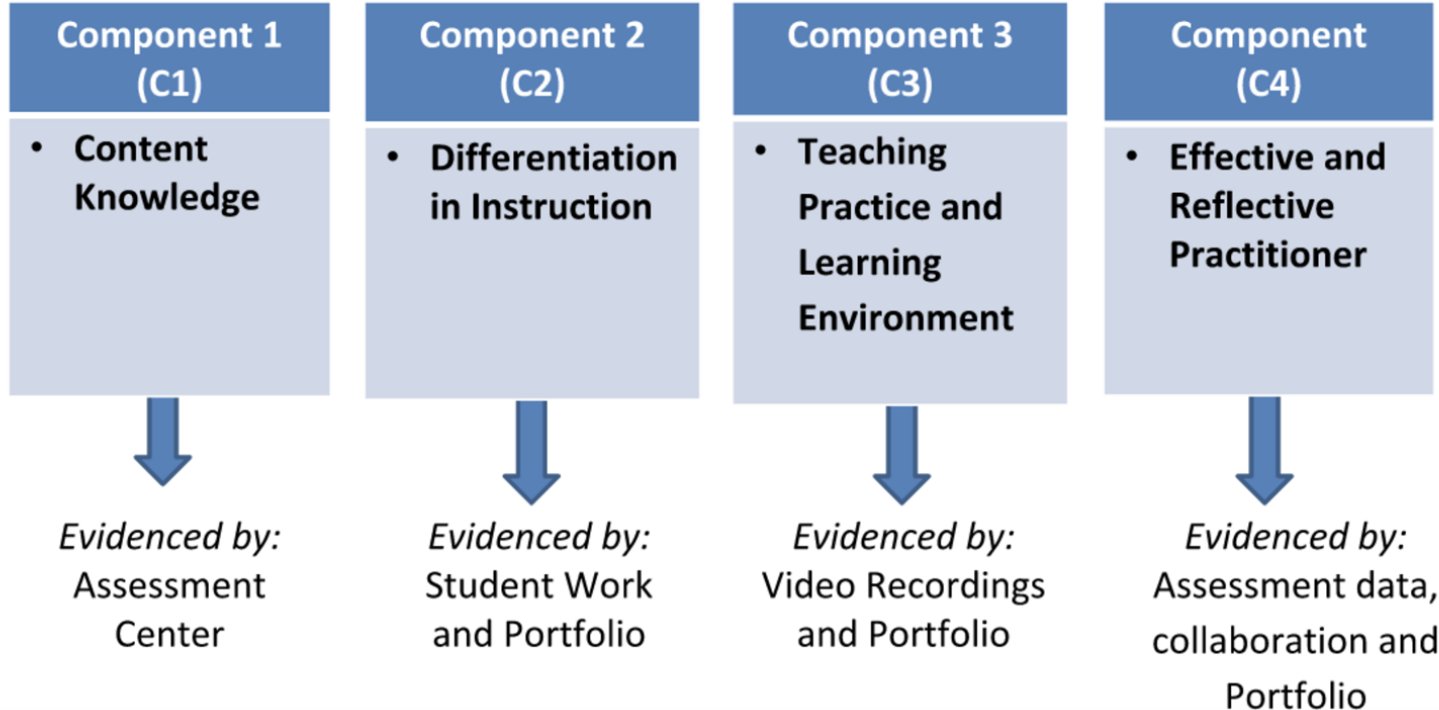

Component 1 (Content Knowledge)

TEST

Exercise 1: Integration of General Education with Career and Technical Education In this exercise, you will use your knowledge of general education and of career and technical education to describe and justify a contextualized learning experience that will integrate specified skills from another discipline with career and technical skills. You will be asked to reply to one prompt.

Exercise 2: Employability Skills In this exercise, you will describe a worksite simulation activity appropriate for developing a specified employability skill and provide a rationale for why this activity would be effective. You will be asked to reply to one prompt.

Exercise 3: Work-based Learning In this exercise, you will use your knowledge of work-based learning to describe a learning experience appropriate for middle school or high school students in your career and technical education area. You will be asked to reply to one prompt.

A computer-based assessment that requires you to demonstrate your understanding of content knowledge and pedagogical practices for teaching your content area. You must demonstrate knowledge of developmentally appropriate content, which is necessary for teaching across the full range and ability level of your chosen certificate area.

This component counts for 40% of your total score.

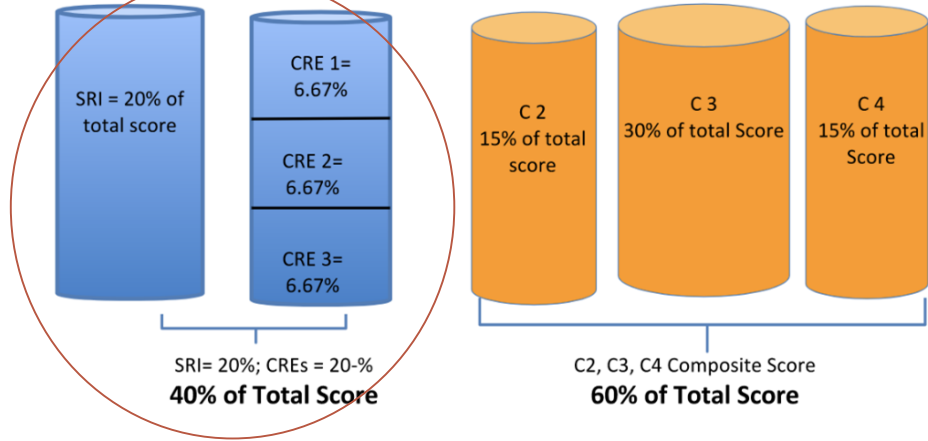

This portfolio entry requires that candidates gather and analyze information about individual students' strengths and needs and use that information to design and implement instruction to advance student learning and achievement. You will submit selected student work samples that demonstrate the students' growth over time and a written commentary that analyzes your instructional choices.

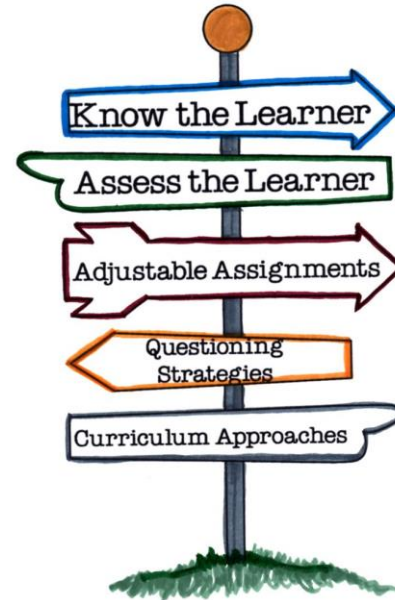

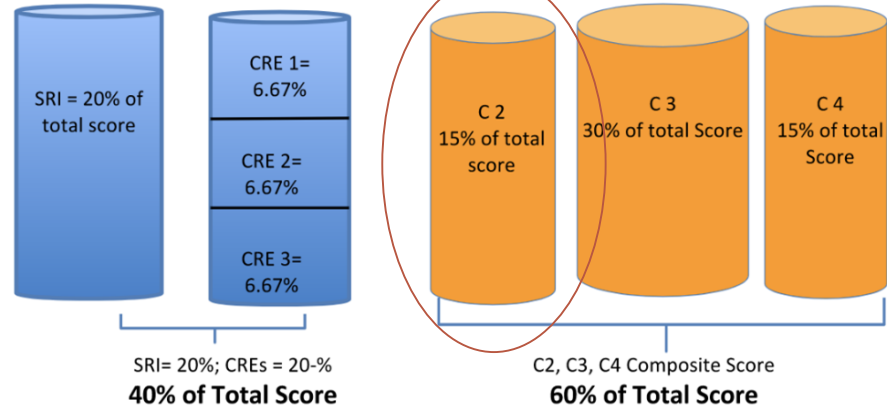

This portfolio entry requires video recordings of interactions between you and your students and among your students. You will also submit a written commentary in which you describe, analyze and reflect on the impact of your teaching on your students.

This component counts for **30%** of your total score.

- 2 different instructional formats (small group, classroom demonstration, problem-based learning, hands-on activity, presentations, critique, student led discussion or anything that shows student engagement.)
- 2 lessons from different instructional units
